

TEST CORRECTIONS TEMPLATE

Your job is to find out why you missed what you missed and then correct it. This does not mean asking a friend and then writing what he/she put. You won't learn anything this way. So instead:

I. Look over the test.

II. Use any resources you need to find the correct answer.

III. If you had to look up a word **IN THE DICTIONARY NOT ONLINE**, then write the word in Latin with all its forms (i.e. noun/adjective base, principal parts, etc.) and also its English meaning in the context of the sentence you missed it in.

IV. If you had to look up a noun or verb form in your text or your Student's Latin Grammar, then write what page you found the info on and describe the problem you had with the form. For example, did you mistake an accusative for a nominative...or a second declensions nominative plural for a third declension dative singular?

V. If you did not understand or recognize the grammar of a construction, then go back to your class notes, the back of your text or your Student's Latin Grammar and find an explanation that will help you. Then copy that explanation onto your test corrections.

VI. For daily life/civ info, just go to the end of the chapter and reread it very carefully. Then make the correction.

I know this seems a bit tedious and time-consuming, but in the long run, you will actually learn the language more effectively and then in the future any work you do will be fluent. You will also benefit by learning how to analyze your own mistakes for your own benefit, a skill that is useful for many things in life!
