*Write no more than ten words. Use an action verb rather than a be verb, and have the agent do the action. Write the sentence in present tense, even if the story took place in the past. This sentence must *summarize*, or tell about, the crucial elements of the story. Think about who, what, where, when, why, and how.

For example:

David kills Goliath in the battle of Jericho.

Or better yet:

At Jericho, David kills Goliath with a rock and sling.

Or Perhaps even better:

Using a rock and sling, David kills Goliath at Jericho.

But avoid this:

In a big hangin' battle scene this majorly big dude called Goliath was killed by this smaller but more buff guy David who basically ended up as a statue that was carved by this Italian guy Michelangelo which is also a pizza place but I really don't go there very often and a sling was used by the David guy to stone, but not in a drug-oriented way, the giant guy.
